Rodent Abatement

Using Bait Boxes allows us to control the rodent population for the affected area or areas.



Fire Ants

This wasp will also occupy a paper nest. They are often very stealthy and are not shy. Keep your head on a pivot if you see them.



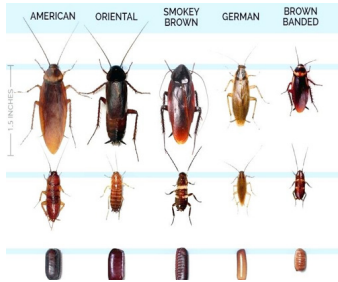
Yellow Jacket Wasps
